
Your 4 Moments for Hand Hygiene



| 1 | BEFORE initial patient / patient environment contact | WHEN? | Clean your hands when entering: before touching patient or before touching any object or furniture in the patient's environment or before putting on gloves. To protect the patient/patient environment from harmful germs carried on your hands. |

| 2 | BEFORE aseptic procedure | WHEN? WHY? | Clean your hands immediately before any aseptic procedure. To protect the patient against harmful germs, including the patient's own germs, entering his or her body. |
| 3 | AFTER body fluid exposure risk | WHEN? WHY? | Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids. To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful germs. |
| 4 | AFTER patient / patient environment contact | WHEN? | Clean your hands when leaving: after touching patient or after touching any object or furniture in the patient's environment or after removing gloves. To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful germs. |
