***Chemical Type:** see Equipment Cleaning and Disinfection Manual for cleaning and disinfecting electronic equipment.

****Cleaning type**

Daily Cleaning	Cleaning and disinfection of all environments where resident care is provided.
Discharge Cleaning	Cleaning and disinfection that occurs upon discharge of a resident. The resident environment, including the resident room or bed space, bathroom, equipment and other items or surfaces inside the room or bed space should be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
Isolation Discharge Cleaning	Cleaning and disinfection that occurs upon discharge of a resident or discontinuation of any additional precautions. In addition to the Discharge Cleaning, privacy and shower curtains are changed; toilet paper, paper towel, glove box, toilet brush and any remaining personal items are discarded and replaced
2nd Cleaning of High Touch Surfaces	Additional cleaning and disinfection of high touch surfaces in the resident room/environment and connected bathroom that occurs approximately 6-8 hours after the initial daily cleaning. Enhanced cleaning for case level.
