

Infection Control Manual – Residential Care Part 3 – Infection Control Standards IC4: Resident Health Program

IC4: 0100 Admission Assessment

1.0 STANDARD

All applicants for admission are assessed prior to admission for infections which may require specific infection control precautions.

2.0 PROCEDURE

2.1 The Director of Care/Manager/Designate shall:

Gather health data regarding history of, or exposure to the following

- Tuberculosis; See TB Screening Standard and Sample Screening Tool Appendix III
- Chickenpox

Note any other relevant conditions such as:

- Blood borne pathogens (e.g. Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, HIV)
- Antibiotic resistant Organisms (e.g. MRSA, VRE, ESBL)
- Skin and soft tissue infections (e.g. Scabies, lice)
- Gastroenteritis
- Pre-disposition to any infection or a recent history of infection

Gather immunization data including last dose & reaction and update vaccine/boosters as required. See Appendix I: Immunization Guidelines

- Influenza Immunization
- Pneumococcal Immunization
- Combined diphtheria tetanus vaccination

Implement control measures as required

Ensure appropriate interdisciplinary communication

- Advise the resident and family of any required precautions
- Notify Public Health and Licensing of reportable communicable diseases. See Reportable Communicable Diseases Appendix II Facilities licensed under the Community Care Facilities Licensing need to notify their local Licensing Office.
