

Infection Control Manual – Residential Care Part 3 - Infection Control Standards **IC5: Routine Practice**

IC5: 0900 Specimen Handling and Transport

1.0 **STANDARD**

All specimens are considered infectious and will be collected appropriately and handled in a manner to prevent contamination of staff and the environment. All staff shall follow Routine Practices when handling specimens.

2.0 **PROCEDURE**

2.1 Staff shall

- Wear gloves when handling specimens
- Collect specimens as per the facility policy or lab manual
- Avoid contaminating the outside of the specimen container. Clean and dry the outside of the container if necessary
- Perform hand hygiene after handling specimen and removing gloves
- Clearly label specimen. Complete requisition
- Secure each specimen and requisition in an individual biohazard (ziplock-type) bag for the transportation to the lab
- Send specimen to the lab as per agency contract and protocols
