Launch of the LTC Quality Improvement Repository

What's happening?

- The LTC Quality expansion team has launched a Quality Improvement (QI) Repository on **Feb 13, 2025**.
- The QI repository is a centralized resource showcasing QI initiatives across all Fraser Health (FH) LTC communities, including both Owned & Operated and Affiliated.
- It aims to increase awareness, inspire care community leaders to initiate their own QI projects, and support the adoption of best practices. It also serves as a reference tool, allowing leaders to build on existing ideas, measures, and strategies rather than reinventing the wheel.
- The QI Repository is available to all LTC leadership within FH, including representatives from both FH-Owned & Operated, as well as Affiliated LTC communities. This includes QI champions, Care Community Medical Directors, and other leads within your care community.

How this may affect you?

For FH-Owned and Operated (O&O) LTC:

For Affiliate LTC or Non-FH users:

Please monitor your email for a time-sensitive message. **This email can take up to 4 weeks to receive.** This email will require action within **48 hours** and will include instructions on confidentiality and setting up Multi-Factor Authentication. If the deadline is missed, you will need to re-submit the form.
