## Resident Assessment Instrument-Minimum Data Set 2.0 education for long-term care leaders

### What's happening?

- The Resident Assessment Instrument-Minimum Data Set 2.0 (RAI-MDS 2.0) system is a tool designed to help long-term care community staff in gathering and analyzing information, aimed at enhancing a resident's quality of care and life.
- Strong comprehension of the system is vital for long-term care (LTC) leaders to ensure data accuracy, foster collaborative decision-making, and identify areas for improvement through data analysis.
- To support LTC leaders in refreshing and broadening their understanding, regional clinical nurse educators have organized a two-part webinar series in May and June 2024.
- Session #1 will provide an overview of the RAI assessment, coding, and common errors.
- Session #2 focuses on interpreting and utilization outputs like outcomes scales, clinical assessment protocols and resource utilization potential.

- Nurses, allied health professionals and other team members involved in RAI assessments are also welcome to participate.
