Fraser Health Guidelines: Admissions to Long-Term Care, Assisted Living or Convalescent Care during COVID-19

Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide guidance to Long-Term Care, Convalescent Care and Assisted Living providers (LTC, CV and AL) when accepting admissions (including both new admissions, admissions from another LTC, CV, or AL site and individuals returning from an acute stay). These guidelines are based on direction from the Fraser Health Emergency Operations Centre and Medical Health Officers; they may change in relation to new data, COVID-19 Pandemic changes, hospital surge and/or additional health orders.

Admissions to LTC/AL/CV from ACUTE

Clients with a previous positive COVID test

Clients without a previous positive COVID test

Admission may proceed after either:

- *at least 10 days post symptom resolution OR
- **20 days post symptom onset with symptoms resolved OR
- 2 negative COVID-19 swabs 24 hours apart

Droplet precautions/isolation <u>are not</u> required post transfer if one of these criteria met

Admission may proceed after:

 one negative Nasopharyngeal Swab for COVID-19, 24 hours prior to transfer (+/- 8 hours); however it is acceptable within 48 hours of transfer

Droplet precautions/isolation <u>are required</u> for 14 days post transfer

Admissions to LTC/AL/CV from Community and LTC, CV, AL Inter-Facility Transfers

Admissions to LTC from community are based on an * Intolerable Risk.

Clients with a previous positive COVID test

Clients without a previous positive COVID test

Admission **may proceed** for:

- Clients at least 10 days post symptom resolution
- Clients who are asymptomatic <u>do not</u> require a Nasopharyngeal Swab for COVID-19

Droplet precautions/isolation <u>are no</u>t required post transfer

Admission may proceed for:

- Clients who are symptomatic and those who are asymptomatic and <u>unable</u> to self-isolate require <u>one</u> <u>negative</u> Nasopharyngeal Swab for COVID-19 within 48 hours prior to admission
- Clients who are asymptomatic and <u>able</u> to self-isolate <u>do not</u> require a Nasopharyngeal Swab for COVID-19

Droplet precautions/isolation <u>are required</u> for 14 days post transfer



- *Applies to individuals hospitalized for reasons un-related to COVID-19
- **Acute care staff refer to Discharge Process for Laboratory-Confirmed COVID-19 Patients in Acute Care re: Exception Requests.

Admissions from Acute


