

# How do I get a COVID-19 test?

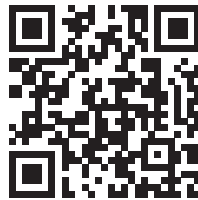
There are two types of tests for COVID-19:  
**Rapid antigen tests and Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests**

## *Rapid antigen tests*

Rapid antigen tests are widely available and free at participating pharmacies. Anyone can ask for a kit without having to show identification.

Visitors to pharmacies can also pick up a kit for someone else. Pharmacies will hand out kits one at a time.

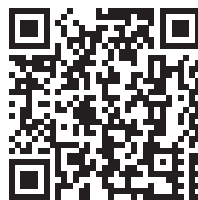
## *Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests*

In most cases a PCR test is not required, you can safely complete a rapid test at home.

If your primary care provider believes a PCR test is required and you are eligible, they will provide you with a requisition.

If you don't have access to a primary care provider or can't get an appointment within three days of developing symptoms, you can call 811, Service BC (1-800-663-7867) or Fraser Health Virtual Care (1-888-268-4319).
