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# \*Reminder\* Caring for Older People Living with HIV in LTC/AL - Ongoing call for study participation

- The Fraser Health Authority's Long-Term Care and Assisted Living (LTC/AL) Research Unit and Simon Fraser University is still seeking participation in a CIHR-funded research study: Caring for Older People Living with HIV in LTC/AL in the Fraser Health Region.
