

FAQs for the Fraser Health Evaluation Community during the COVID-19 Pandemic Phase 3 | 2021 February

GENERAL OFFICE INFORMATION

Is the Fraser Health Department of Evaluation and Research (DERS) still open?

DERS remains open during the COVID-19 pandemic, however, our operations are running with limited onsite personnel. Most of our team members are working virtually offsite to comply with public health orders for physical distancing. The best method to contact our team is through email at this time.

What evaluation services does DERS provide during COVID-19?

DERS offers free consulting services to support evaluation projects in Fraser Health. Our services include program evaluation planning, logic model development, report writing and dissemination, and survey development.

We also have a newly established Evaluation Shared Working Team that meets bi-weekly to share knowledge and coordinate evaluation activities during COVID-19. Does my evaluation need a Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA)?

It is recommended that you run your project through [Fraser Health Information Privacy](#) to ensure it complies with privacy and security requirements. Information Privacy will determine whether your project requires a Privacy Impact Assessment. Depending on your project, you will be required to complete additional processes including:

Data Access Agreement (DAA)

- This process ensures the use of data in the evaluation project complies with FHA privacy guidelines.
- All evaluations using Personal Information need a DAA.

Surveys Review

- All surveys need to be reviewed by Fraser Health Information Privacy prior to the collection of information.
- If the survey involves Personal Information, then an informed consent will be required.

Information Technology approval

- Additional approvals might be required if the project involves a technological piece such as the implementation of a software, data collection tool, etc. Contact your department's [Health Informatics Customer Service Liaison](#) to determine the needs of your project.

Do I need consent to contact for evaluation activities?

We do notify patients via a "Patient Notification Poster" that we may contact them for evaluation purposes. While the preferred method of contact is through a letter sent in the mail, we have access to other methods of contacting clients. When we contact clients, we need to be sensitive to clients' situations. When using technology, we also need to consider the lack of security and necessary validation requirements. Please ensure you document your contact plans when submitting your Survey Review. If you have any questions, you can contact privacy@fraserhealth.ca in order for a privacy expert to assist you in validation processes and privacy best practices.

VIRTUAL EVALUATION ACTIVITIES

Can I work on research projects from home?

Yes. All evaluation activities that can be conducted virtually must continue to do so. Online access to databases housed in Fraser Health servers and library materials will be maintained.

Virtual work must be conducted in compliance with Fraser Health Privacy Policy and Information Security Standards.

What information is required to conduct evaluation data collection and activities virtually?
