^{*}FNS = Forensic Nursing Service: 24/7 specialized care for all ages and genders following sexual violence, domestic violence and family violence within 7 days of the incident. Program operates from Surrey Memorial Hospital ER and Abbotsford Regional Hospital ER. Patients do not need to report to police when presenting for medical care. Options will be discussed with patient at the hospital.

^{*}Telephone Consent: to obtain telephone consent read the consent paragraph to the patient. If you believe they do not understand this information or are unable to consent then telephone consent cannot be obtained and the referral cannot be made. We welcome self referrals. Embrace Clinic Community Referral Information

Referrals can also be made by calling the clinic directly or by self-referral of the patient.

Calling the clinic directly usually results in a more timely appointment.

Embrace Clinic is a specialty medical clinic operated by Fraser Health Authority as part of the Forensic Nursing Service. Unlike the 24/7 acute care provided by the Forensic Nursing Service, Embrace Clinic is open weekdays during general business hours and provides non-urgent, specialized episodic medical care with a focus on recent survivors of violence.

Embrace Clinic cannot become a patient's regular health care provider. We will attempt to stabilize a patient's general health and then assist with connection to a regular primary health care provider such as a family doctor or nurse practitioner whenever possible.

Embrace Clinic does not provide prescriptions for controlled drugs or complete disability forms.

Appropriate Referrals:

☐ Recent experience with interpersonal violence and in need of medical care in relation to this
□ All genders
□ Mature minors and adults only
☐ Do not need prescription for a controlled substance or completion of disability/government forms
☐ Do not require emergency or acute health care services (i.e. significant head trauma, fractures, severe bleeding). These patients should be referred to the closest emergency department for care which may include calling 911 for appropriate transportation via ambulance.
☐ Do not want a full forensic examination (i.e. specimen collection for use as evidence). Patients wanting a full forensic exam should be referred to their local Forensic Nursing Service if the incident occurred less than 7 days ago. Embrace will see patients after 7 days and can provide some forensic care as appropriate and available. Call us to consult about best location for these patients to be seen.

All referred patients will be contacted within 3 business days.

We have same day and next business day appointments available.
