

# FRASER HEALTH OVERDOSE EMERGENCY PUBLIC REPORT – JULY 2018

## WHAT'S HAPPENING

Fraser Health and its partners are taking a number of steps to reduce opioid/fentanyl-related overdoses, including the following new actions in July 2018:

- Announcement of a three month pilot project making fentanyl test strip drug checking available at selected community locations, including some Public Health Units. For a full list of locations, please click here.
- Community Action Team grants were awarded to teams in Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Maple Ridge, Langley, and Surrey. Planned projects will touch on stigma reduction, education and peer engagement.
- Fraser Health supported implementation of Overdose Prevention Sites at the three new modular house locations in Surrey.
- Continued engagement and initiation of patients to iOAT services in Surrey, ramping up to capacity of 50 patients.

### **FATAL OVERDOSES**

According to the BC Coroners Service, there were 44 illicit drug overdose deaths in Fraser Health in July 2018 compared with 31 in June 2018.

#### SUPERVISED CONSUMPTION AND OVERDOSE PREVENTION SITES

#### **Supervised Consumption Sites**

In July 2018, there were 3,107 visits for substance use and 29 overdoses reversed at Supervised Consumption Sites. In the previous month, there were 4,108 visits and 46 overdoses reversed.

#### **Overdose Prevention Sites**

In July 2018, there were 6,208 visits for any reason, 2,477 visits for substance use, and 5 overdoses at Overdose Prevention Sites. In the previous month, there were 5,585 visits for any reason and 12 overdoses reversed.

# **OVERDOSES ATTENDED BY BC AMBULANCE**

In June 2018 there were 448 overdoses responded to by BC Ambulance Services, compared to 510 in May 2018. The majority of overdoses year to date occurred in males (70%) and in people aged 19 to 39 years (54%). 28% of persons declined transportation to medical services from BC Ambulance.
