

FRASER HEALTH OVERDOSE EMERGENCY PUBLIC REPORT – SEPTEMBER 2018

WHAT'S HAPPENING

Fraser Health and its partners are working hard to reduce opioid/fentanyl-related overdoses, including the following new actions in September 2018:

- Hosted a peer engagement strategy forum with more than 20 people with lived and living experience, featuring a facilitated dialogue to review and inform Fraser Health's draft Peer Engagement Strategy.
- Community Overdose Innovation Grants were awarded by the Community Action Initiative for projects in Tri-Cities, Surrey, Mission and Hope/Kent/Agassiz
- Fraser Health is in its second month of a community drug checking pilot assessing the utility and feasibility of drug checking outside of our supervised consumption sites and overdose prevention sites. For a full list of locations, please <u>click here</u>.

FATAL OVERDOSES

According to the BC Coroners Service, there were 27 illicit drug overdose deaths in Fraser Health in August 2018, compared with 44 in July 2018. Data for September 2018 was not yet available at the time this report was published.

SUPERVISED CONSUMPTION AND OVERDOSE PREVENTION SITES

Supervised Consumption Sites

In September 2018, there were 2,958 visits for substance use and 23 overdoses reversed at Supervised Consumption Sites. In the previous month, there were 3,334 visits and 32 overdoses reversed.

Overdose Prevention Sites

In September 2018, there were 4,666 visits for any reason, 3,266 visits for substance use, and 4 overdoses reversed at Overdose Prevention Sites. In the previous month, there were 5,264 visits for any reason, 2,831 visits for substance use and 1 overdose reversed.

OVERDOSES ATTENDED BY BC AMBULANCE

In August 2018, there were 536 overdoses responded to by BC Ambulance Services across Fraser Health, compared to 571 in July 2018. The majority of overdoses year to date occurred among males (71%) and people aged 19 to 39 years (55%). Twenty nine percent of people declined transportation to medical services from BC Ambulance.
