

FRASER HEALTH OVERDOSE RESPONSE PUBLIC REPORT – DECEMBER 2020

FRASER HEALTH SURVEILLANCE SUMMARY - DECEMBER 2020

FATAL OVERDOSES

According to BC Coroners Service, there were 55 illicit drug toxicity deaths in Fraser Health in December 2020 and 58 in November 2020. The total number of drug toxicity deaths in 2020 (568 deaths) was the highest ever recorded in Fraser Health. All Fraser Health communities had marked increases in the number drug toxicity deaths compared to 2019 (Table 1).

Illicit drug toxicity deaths reported by BC Coroners Service include illicit drug overdoses involving street drugs (heroin, cocaine, MDMA, methamphetamine, etc.), medications that were not prescribed to the deceased, combinations of the above, with prescribed medications, and those overdoses where the origin of drug is not known.

OVERDOSES ATTENDED BY BC AMBULANCE

In November 2020, there were 549 overdoses responded to by BC Ambulance Services across Fraser Health, compared to 704 in October 2020. Almost all Fraser Health communities saw marked increases in overdoses, especially Delta, New Westminster, and Agassiz/Harrison (see Table 2).
