

FRASER HEALTH OVERDOSE RESPONSE PUBLIC REPORT – FEBRUARY 2021

FRASER HEALTH SURVEILLANCE SUMMARY – FEBRUARY 2021

FATAL OVERDOSES

According to BC Coroners Service, there were 62 illicit drug toxicity deaths in Fraser Health in February 2021 (Table 1). This matches the highest monthly count in Fraser Health previously reported in August 2020 (62 deaths), and is a 121% increase from the number of deaths reported in February 2020 (28 deaths). Based on the first two months of 2021, the largest increases since 2020 are being seen in Burnaby, Maple Ridge, and Surrey.

Illicit drug toxicity deaths reported by BC Coroners Service include illicit drug overdoses involving street drugs (heroin, cocaine, MDMA, methamphetamine, etc.), medications that were not prescribed to the deceased, combinations of the above, with prescribed medications, and those overdoses where the origin of drug is not known.

OVERDOSES ATTENDED BY BC AMBULANCE

In January 2021, BC Ambulance Services responded to 610 overdoses across Fraser Health, an 8% increase from the average number of overdoses in the previous 12 months. The highest increases were in Maple Ridge, Delta, and South Surrey / White Rock (see Table 2).
