

TOXIC DRUG POISONING RESPONSE **PUBLIC REPORT, SEPTEMBER 2022**

ILLICIT DRUG TOXICITY DEATHS

- According to BC Coroners Service, there were 35 illicit drug toxicity deaths in Fraser Health in September
- This is less than deaths reported in the previous month, with 50 deaths in August 2022.
- Compared to 2021, the greatest increase in drug toxicity deaths in 2022 has been seen in Abbotsford (+9%).

PARAMEDIC-ATTENDED TOXIC DRUG POISONING EVENTS

- BC paramedics responded to 500 toxic drug poisoning events across Fraser Health in September 2022;
 this is a 32% decrease compared to the previous 12 months (Table 2).
- Compared to 2021, the greatest increases in paramedic-attended toxic drug poisoning events have occurred in Mission (+23%), Abbotsford (+18%), and Port Moody/ Anmore/ Belcarra (+10%).
- In 2022, the largest decreases in the rate of paramedic-attended toxic drug poisoning events have occurred in Port Coquitlam (-49%), Hope (-47%), and Agassiz/Harrison (-45%) compared to 2021.
