

Construction Notice for Neighbours

Construction excavation traffic will change to Keary and Allen Streets (5 days, now to mid-September)

What's Excavation trucks will load up and exit at Keary Street Happening and use Allen Street

Scope of Bird Construction has informed us as of Wednesday, Aug. 30th, excavation truck traffic flow will change now that the previous access points off Brunette Avenue have been excavated and are no longer available.

Bird expects this impact to be for about five days over the course of three weeks. Target dates are Wed. August 30, Thurs. August 31, Tues. September 12, Wed. September 13, and Mon. September 18 but these dates are subject to change.

Excavation trucks will enter and exit a loading area near the corner of Keary Street and Brunette Avenue from about 7:30am to 3:30pm on the five days.

Impact to You Expect more traffic than usual along Allen Street, in the hospital's service lane, and on Keary Street near Brunette on the days as trucks access the loading area.

Access via Brunette to/from Keary and Allen Streets will continue to be possible.

Drivers and pedestrians should exercise caution when accessing the area.

Parkade access will still be available at Copperstone and Anvil condominiums.

Obey all construction flag persons. They are there for your safety and protection.

We sincerely apologize for the inconvenience. Bird Construction and their contractors will endeavour to minimize the impact of noise, dust and disruption to our neighbours in accordance with the City's regulations and <u>Good Neighbour Protocol</u>.
