Construction Notice for Neighbours

Two lanes of BRUNETTE AVENUE will close between Allen and Keary Streets for Saturday, April 28

What's Brunette Avenue is being impacted for one day while the hospital Happening installs large equipment at its construction site

Work/Area **Affected**

Scope of On Saturday, April 28th the two southbound lanes of Brunette Avenue between Keary and Allen Streets will be temporarily closed as trucks and a crane move large equipment into the hospital's construction site.

> Two-way traffic will be maintained. Southbound vehicles will be diverted into the northbound left lane, and northbound vehicles will be restricted to the northbound right lane.

The City is aware of this work and has issued necessary permits.

Work will occur between 7:00am and 8:00 pm. (Dates/times are subject to change).

Impact to You Bird Construction has indicated the following:

Expect traffic along Brunette Avenue to be slower.

Access via Brunette to/from Keary and Allen Streets will be possible.

Pedestrians will still have access to the sidewalk along Brunette Avenue for SkyTrain access, but watch for flag persons to direct you.

Obey all construction flag persons. They are there for your safety and protection.

We sincerely apologize for the inconvenience. Bird Construction and their contractors will endeavour to minimize the impact of noise, dust and disruption to our neighbours in accordance with the City's regulations and Good Neighbour Protocol.
