

Royal Columbian Hospital Redevelopment



Construction Update: October 26, 2018

Here's an update on road work happening around the hospital.

Sherbrooke Street (From East Columbia Street to just east of Fader St)

- Bird and Telus have finished road/sidewalk work. One manhole cover still needs resetting.
- Expect paving Mon. Oct. 29 to Fri. Nov. 2 weather permitting (though the forecast predicts rain). The City had initially planned to finish paving before Bird Construction's start on Keary Street but BC's recent natural gas pipeline explosion impacted its contractor's asphalt supply.
 - During paving there will be NO access to/from Brunette via Sherbrooke but there will be access to/from East Columbia.

East Columbia Street (From Sherbrooke St. to Keary St.)

- Road/sidewalk work is expected to finish within two weeks (weather permitting).
- Road/sidewalk work from Sherbrooke to Hospital Street has finished and the crosswalk at Hospital Street is now being restored to its original location.
- Some work at the Keary Street intersection has been postponed until 2019 (planned for the northwest and southeast sides of the intersection).

Keary Street (From East Columbia to Brunette Ave)

- Both lanes are closed/under construction at East Columbia St until likely the morning of Nov. 5 preventing thru traffic to Brunette (this is a revised date, but it may happen sooner).
- Thereafter and until early 2019 vehicle access will change throughout the day (to accommodate thru-traffic when possible) as follows:

Keary Street Access as of Approximately Nov. 5 and Until Early 2019

7am-3pm Mon-Fri 9am-3pm Sat	Expect two-way, single-lane alternating thru traffic on Keary. Use E. Columbia OR Brunette to Enter and Exit Keary.
3pm-7pm Mon-Fri 3pm-6pm Sat	Expect no thru traffic on Keary or access to/from E. Columbia St. Use Brunette ONLY to Enter and Exit Keary.
After 7pm Mon-Fri After 6pm Sat All day Sun/Holidays	Expect one-way, eastbound, single-lane thru traffic on Keary. Use E Columbia ONLY to Enter Keary; Use Brunette ONLY to Exit.

 While Sherbrooke is being paved (Oct 29 to Nov 2 weather permitting) we suggest northbound drivers needing access to Keary use East Columbia>Braid>Brunette>Keary (see 'Sherbrooke Street' above).
