UPDATE Actively Dying Adult, Acute, Long-Term Care, Community Care – Clinical Protocol and Pre-Printed Order (PPO)

- The Clinical Protocol and PPOs are to support the care and comfort of adults in long-term care homes and assisted living who are expected to die a natural death in hours to days (attached in email).
- Practice changes:
 - Actively Dying Adults Acute & Long-Term Care Pre-Printed Order:
 - This PPO will be valid for 2 weeks only (and daily monitoring required). After 2 weeks, the pharmacy will require a new PPO.
 - Oral to parental calculation information available in the back of the PPO
 - All other documents: Minor revisions and formatting. No medication change.
- The FH Clinical Policy Office will archive the Actively Dying Caring for Residents in Final Days -Residential Care - Clinical Protocol and Actively Dying Protocol - Caring for Residents in Final Days
