*NEW * COVID-19 Provincial Testing Guidelines update-Test to Treat

- On September 28th, the COVID-19 Viral Testing Guidelines for the Province of British Columbia were updated. Search (bccdc.ca)
- These guidelines were drafted with a focus on testing for the purposes of treatment. The guidelines were
 drafted in collaboration with the COVID Therapeutics Committee (CTC) and COVID Therapy Review and
 Advisory Working Group (CTRAWG) and various other testing subcommittees.
- In summary:
 - Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) testing is no longer routinely indicated and most Testing Centers offering it have closed.
 - Self-administered Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) are recommended for all symptomatic patients who are eligible for COVID-19 therapies for mild-moderate disease as the first line testing strategy. RAT sensitivity approaches ≥93% if the patient testing is symptomatic, more than 48 hours from symptom onset, and repeats the RAT every 24-48 hours if it is initially negative.
 - As such, the CTC is emphasizing a serial RAT approach to identify patients who have COVID-19
 who are eligible for treatment: patients should self-administer a RAT as soon as they feel unwell
 and the RAT may be repeated daily within the 5-day treatment window, if negative.
 - PCR testing may be ordered at the discretion of the clinician and is still recommended in acute care settings or to identify variants of concern for surveillance purposes.

NEW Pressure Injury Reduction Project- Call for interest LTC and AL

- One of Fraser Health's strategic goals in Long-Term Care and Assisted Living is to reduce the number of Pressure injuries acquired within the Long-term Care and Assisted Living setting.
- A shared work team/project team is being assembled and is seeking representation from our affiliated and operated partners.
- Although the amount of work and schedule is still being determined, at this time, we are anticipating a 2hour meeting every two weeks with required work between these meetings.
