NEW Reflex Testing - Population & Public Health

- BCCDC is no longer doing reflex testing (automatic testing for influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) & COVID) when polymerase chain reaction (PCR) swabs are sent for Covid-19 testing only.
- Moving forward, if a resident has Respiratory Illness symptoms and a PCR swab is being completed, please ensure to check all three pathogens: COVID-19, influenza and RSV when submitting PCR swabs for testing and/or any other testing recommended by the client's Most Responsible Physician (MRP).
